

Goal 1 - Digitisation

- 1. Digitising and making 20th and 21st century literary works available to the wider European community. To stimulate interest in cultural heritage and enhance intercultural dialogue with national, regional and local communities.
 - Involving the community in the selection, digitisation and dissemination processes,
 - rightsclearing and fully respecting the current copyright regimes, (!)
 - digitising the selected material
 - creation of a common portal to present the results





Goal 2 - Accessibility at all levels


- 2. To improve access to 20th and 21st century textual works for blind and visually impaired users and for a younger audience
 - developing alternative dissemination formats and providing the skills, competences and know-how to develop them
 - evaluate current technical solutions and improve current workflows and processes
 - ensuring the sustainable use of books in alternative formats






Goal 3 – Copyright clearance







The workflow underlying the development based on the results of the questionnaire:








